

RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY ALERT



A Message from the 109th Precinct

There have been recent incidents where homes are being burglarized.

Sliding glass doors along with upper floor windows and balconies have been the prevalent entry points.

Please follow these crime prevention tips to avoid becoming a victim.

- . Keep doors and windows on all floors closed and LOCKED at all times.
- Secure any and all objects that can be used as a climbing aid to gain access to upper floors. Articles such as ladders, tables and chairs.
- Place adhesive security film to the inside of windows <u>AND SLIDING GLASS DOOR</u> to prevent the glass from being shattered, thus permitting entry into your home. Add a patio bolt for the sliding glass door.
- Obtain motion detection cameras to be directed toward the view of doors and windows. If motion is
 detected, the image will be transmitted to your portable electronic device to be remotely viewed.
 Immediately call 911 to relay a detailed description of the intruder to the dispatcher.
- An alarm system is also a good deterrent and highly recommended. If you already have one, <u>ALWAYS</u>
 keep it armed. Consider adding glass break sensors if you don't have them already.
- Secure all cash, jewelry, and other loose valuables into a safe or lockbox that can be bolted into the floor.

An IMPORTANT Message from the 109th Precinct

The 109th Precinct has recently been experiencing an increase in burglaries, robberies, vehicle thefts, vehicle break-ins, and package theft. Please follow these crime prevention tips to avoid becoming a victim of these crimes:

BURGLARY:

- Keep doors and windows <u>LOCKED</u> at all times. Consider purchasing augmentation devices that further strengthen
 your existing doors and windows.
- · Obtain an alarm system with motion detection cameras. Keep them ACTIVATED at all times.
- · Schedule a security assessment of your home with the 109th Precinct Crime Prevention Officer.

VEHICLE THEFT / BREAK-INS:

- NEVER leave keys in the ignition of vehicle while it is running, unlocked, and unattended.
- · Ensure to activate alarm systems, GPS tracking, and any other theft deterrent devices you may have.
- REMOVE all valuable property from vehicle. Keep doors and windows closed and locked at ALL times.
- · Enroll your vehicle in the Combat Auto Theft (CAT) Program.

ROBBERY:

- Minimize the amount of money and other valuables you carry by only taking items necessary for the day.
- In the event you are robbed, comply with directions for your safety. Call 911 when safe with a detailed description.

PACKAGE THEFT:

- Ensure that either yourself or another person is able to accept package and not leave it unattended.
- Ship package to your place of employment or pick it up at the delivery facility.
